Whereas, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance in 1925 to be observed annually the week of October 9th in commemoration of the 1871 Great Chicago Fire; and

AND

Whereas, the City of White Settlement is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting our city and the city's first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education; and

AND

Whereas, fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

Whereas, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires almost in half and residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more prepared and will therefore be more likely to survive a fire; and

Whereas, the 2023 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention," effectively serves to remind us to stay alert and use caution when cooking to reduce the risk of kitchen fires.

Now, Therefore We, the Mayor and City Council, do hereby proclaim October 8–14, 2023, as Fire Prevention Week throughout this city, and urge all residents to check their kitchens for fire hazards and use safe cooking practices during Fire Prevention Week 2023, and to support the many public safety activities and efforts of White Settlement's fire and emergency services.

AND

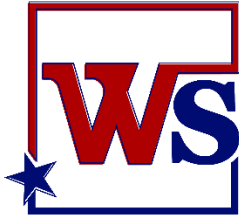

SECOND RESTATED EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THE STATE OF TEXAS §
 §
COUNTY OF TARRANT §

This Second Restated Employment Agreement (“**Agreement**”) is made and entered into on _____ by and between the City of White Settlement, Texas, a municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as the “**City**”), and Amy Arnold, an individual (hereinafter referred to as “**Employee**”). City and Employee are sometimes hereinafter collectively referred to as the “parties.”

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on July 31, 2017, the parties entered into an Employment Agreement, which sets forth the terms and conditions of Employee’s employment as the City Secretary of City, which was subsequently amended by an Employment Agreement Amendments entered into on September 11, 2018, and as further amended by a Second Amendment of Employment Agreement entered into on November 5, 2019, a Third Amendment of Employment Agreement entered into on June 22, 2020, a Fourth Amendment of Employment Agreement entered into on October 6, 2020, and a Fifth Amendment of Employment Agreement entered into on August 3, 2021 (all of the foregoing agreements collectively referred to as the “**Employment Agreement**”); and

WHEREAS, due to numerous amendments to the Employment Agreement, Employee and City desire to have one comprehensive agreement restating the terms of the Employment Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into a comprehensive agreement on February 1, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the parties amended that comprehensive agreement in a separate agreement on September 6, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the parties still desire to have one comprehensive agreement restating the terms of the Employment Agreement and the subsequent comprehensive agreement and amendment thereto; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement replaces the Employment Agreement, comprehensive agreement and amendment thereto in its entirety; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

1. Duties and Scope of Employment.

(A) ***Position and Duties.*** For the term of her employment under this Agreement, the City agrees to continued employment of the Employee as its City Secretary/Chief Governance Officer reporting directly to the City Council. Employee shall have such duties, powers, authority,

responsibilities, and obligations as provided by the City Secretary/Chief Governance Officer Job Description and the Home Rule Charter of the City of White Settlement, Texas. Further, the Employee shall comply with (collectively “Applicable Laws and Authorities”): State and Federal Law; the City Charter; if any; all City Policies, Rules, Regulations, and Ordinances as they exist or may hereinafter be amended; and all lawful Council directives. All duties assigned to the Employee by the Council shall be appropriated to and consistent with the professional role and responsibility of the City Secretary/Chief Governance Officer position.

a. The City Secretary shall:

- 1) Give notice of all official public meetings of the City Council in a manner consistent with this Charter and state laws;
- 2) Attend and record proceedings of official meetings of the City Council;
- 3) Serve as the custodian of all official records of the City and City Council as the Records Management Officer;
- 4) Serve as the liaison to the public as the Public Information Officer;
- 5) Schedule, supervise, administer and coordinate City general and special elections, including preparation of all election related Council action items, in accordance with the Texas Election Code and any other applicable law;
- 6) Hold and maintain the seal of the City and affix this seal to all appropriate documents;
- 7) Hold and maintain the seal of the Economic Development Corporation and affix this seal to all appropriate documents;
- 8) Authenticate, by signature and seal, and record all ordinances, resolutions and proclamations of the City;
- 9) Serve as filing authority for Conflict of Interest Forms;
- 10) Perform duties of coordinator and filing authority for boards and commissions;

- 11) Process and maintain legal filings, such as conflict of interest forms, solicitor's permits, deeds, and Texas Alcoholic Beverages Commission (TABC) licenses;
- 12) Serve as Public Notary;
- 13) Perform duties of Secretary to the Economic Development Corporation; and
- 14) Perform such other duties, as may be required by the City Council, which are consistent with this Charter and state and federal law.

(B) ***Obligations to the City.*** During her employment under this Agreement, the Employee shall devote her full time and energy to her service to the City and shall not be engaged in any competitive or conflicting activity without the express consent of the City Council, provided that Employee may engage in charitable, religious, community or other professional activities that do not substantially interfere with her service to the City. The Employee acknowledges the proper performance of the City Secretary's Duties requires the Employee to generally observe normal business hours and will also often require the performance of necessary services outside of normal business hours. The Employee agrees to devote such additional time as is necessary for the full and proper performance of the City Secretary's Duties and that the compensation herein provided includes compensation for the performance of all and such services. However, the City intends that reasonable time off be permitted the Employee, such as is customary for exempt employees so long as the time off does not interfere with the normal conduct of the office of the City Secretary. The Employee will devote full time and effort to the performance of the City Secretary's Duties, and shall remain in the exclusive employ of the City during the term of this Agreement; provided that with the prior consent of the Council, the Employee may accept outside professional employment which does not interfere with the Employee performing the City Secretary's Duties hereunder. The term "outside professional employment" means professional services provided to third parties for which the Employee is compensated and which are performed on the Employee's time off. Employee shall abide by the City Council's policies and rules regarding her employment during the term of her employment.

(C) ***Designee.*** Employee may temporarily request assistance from staff reporting to the City Manager, at the prior approval of the City Manager, to assist with administrative, not statutory or legally binding, duties while out of the office.

(2) Term of Employment; Review.

(A) Unless sooner terminated in accordance with the provisions of Section 4 of this Agreement, the City agrees to continue to employ the Employee, and Employee agrees to continue in employment with the City, as its City Secretary continuing hereafter for a period of eleven years beginning July 11, 2017 through July 14, 2030. This Agreement will automatically renew for a subsequent three-year period on July 14, 2030, unless either party notifies the other in writing sixty

(60) days prior to the end of the first contract term that the party does not intend to renew the contract.

(B) The Council has appropriated, set aside, and encumbered, and does hereby appropriate, set aside, and encumber, available and other wise unappropriated funds of the City in an amount sufficient to fund and pay all financial obligations of the City pursuant to this Agreement.

(C) The City may, by action of the Council, and with the consent and approval of the Employee, extend the term of this Agreement.

(D) The City Council shall annually review and evaluate the performance of Employee during the term of this Agreement.

- a. **Process.** The annual performance reviews and evaluations shall be within a reasonable time of the anniversary of this Agreement and shall be in writing. The Council shall provide the Employee a reasonable and adequate opportunity to discuss with the Council and/or respond to the Employee's evaluation.
- b. **Confidentiality.** Unless the Employee expressly requests otherwise in writing, except to the extent prohibited by or in material conflict with Applicable Laws and Authorities, the evaluation of the Employee shall at all times be conducted in closed session of the Council and shall be considered confidential to the maximum and full extent permitted by law, unless otherwise requested by the Employee. Nothing herein shall prohibit the Council or the Employee from sharing the content of the Employee's evaluation with their respective legal counsel.

(3) Compensation; Benefits; Expenses.

(A) **Compensation.** For the services rendered by Employee during the term of this Agreement, Employee shall be entitled to the following:

- a. The City shall provide the Employee with an annual salary in the sum of one hundred thirteen thousand three hundred dollars (\$113,300) effective September 1, 2023. This annual salary rate shall be paid to the Employee in equal installments in the schedule as other City employees and shall be paid subject to any applicable withholdings or deductions required by the Applicable Laws and Authorities.

(B) **Benefits.** Unless expressly provided otherwise in this Agreement, in addition to those benefits specifically set forth herein, the Employee shall be entitled to the same benefits that are enjoyed by any other administrative Employee(s) of the City pursuant to all Applicable Laws and Authorities.

- a. **Insurance - Health.** City agrees to pay the premiums for health, dental, vision, and life insurance for Employee pursuant to the plan(s) offered to administrative Employees and provided by the City for health, dental, vision, and life insurance.
- b. **Retirement Benefit.** The City agrees to enroll the Employee into the applicable state or local retirement system and to make at least the same level of contributions for the Employee or on the Employees behalf as the City does for its other administrative Employees consistent with all Applicable Laws and Authorities.
- c. **Paid Leaves- Vacation, Sick/Personal, and Holiday.** The Employee shall be granted 200 vacation hours upon approval and on each anniversary date of this Agreement beginning July 12, 2017, the leave to be in a single period or at different times. The vacation leave taken by the Employee will be taken at such time or time as will least interfere with the performance of the City Secretary's Duties. The Employee is hereby granted the same sick/personal leave benefits as authorized by Council policies for administrative Employees. There is no maximum accrual on sick and vacation leave for the City Secretary. The Employee shall observe the same legal holidays as provided by the City for its administrative Employees.

(C) **Expenses.** The City shall pay or reimburse the Employee for reasonable expenses incurred by the Employee in the continuing performance of the Employee's duties under this Agreement. The City agrees to pay the actual and incidental costs incurred by the Employee for travel. Such actual or incidental costs may include, but are not limited to, gasoline, hotels and accommodations, meals, rental care, and other expenses incurred in the performance of the business of the City. The Employee shall comply with all procedures and documentation requirements in accordance with Applicable Laws and Authorities.

- a. **Professional Development and Dues.** The City agrees to budget for and pay, on behalf of Employee, all professional fees, dues, and seminar/conference registrations and costs together with the costs and expenses, actual and incidental, incurred in participating in conferences, short courses, seminars, of Employee, continued certification of Employee, and in the best interests of the City.
- b. **Bonds.** The City shall bear the full cost of any fidelity or other bonds required of the Employee under any law or ordinance.
- c. **Civil Activities.** The Employee is encouraged to participate in community and civic organizations and activities. The cost of such activities shall be borne by the City.

4. Termination.

(A) **Termination and Severance Pay/Benefits.** This Agreement shall terminate upon any of the following:

- a. Mutual agreement of the Council and Employee in writing and signed by them;
- b. Retirement or death of the Employee;
- c. Termination of the Employee's employment for "good cause" (as defined in paragraph (B) below);
- d. A Unilateral Severance (as defined and set forth in paragraph (C) below); or
- e. At the term date of this Agreement, it shall continue in effect until an agreement is reached and shall not act as an instrument of resignation.

(B) **Good Cause.** For purposes of this Agreement the term "good cause" is defined as:

- a. Any willful, knowing, grossly negligent, or negligent breach, disregard, or habitual neglect of any provision of this Agreement, or any willful, knowing, grossly negligent, or negligent breach, disregard, or habitual neglect of any duty or obligation required to be performed by the Employee under this Agreement or under the Charter and Ordinances of the City and/or Applicable Laws and Authorities.
- b. Any misconduct of the Employee involving an act of moral turpitude, criminal illegality (excepting minor traffic violations), or habitual violations of the traffic laws, whether or not related to the Employee's official duties hereunder.
- c. Any willful, knowing, grossly negligent, or negligent misapplication or misuse, direct or indirect by Employee of public or other funds or other property, real, personal, or mixed, owned by or entrusted to the City, any agency or corporation thereof, or the Employee in her official capacity.

(C) **Unilateral Severance.** As one of the termination events specified above in paragraph (A), the Council may end the employment relationship and terminate this Agreement, at the pleasure of the Council, whether with or without good cause, upon written notice to the Employee as specified below and payment to the Employee of the Severance Benefits (as defined below), and the Current Obligations (the "Unilateral Severance"). If the Council determines that it desires a Unilateral Severance it shall provide written notice to the Employee at least sixty (60) days in advance of the effective date of such termination, which specifies: 1) 75% of the Council has the Council has voted to pursue a Unilateral Severance pursuant to this paragraph (paragraph C) of the Agreement; 2) the effective date of the Unilateral Severance ("Severance Effective Date"), and 3) the City's commitment to pay the Severance Amount (including a specific line item breakdown of the items that constitute the total Severance Amount), the Severance Benefits and the Current Obligations.

- a. On or before the Severance Effective Date, the Employee may give written notice to the City directing that the Severance Amount be paid and payable in a manner directed by the Employee, provided that the total Severance Amount must be paid and payable on or before the first anniversary of the Severance Effective Date and there shall be no limitations other City making all deductions and withholdings required by laws.
- b. The Severance Amount means the total amount of (a) an amount equal to the value of the Employee's current twelve month salary, plus (b) the value of any accrued but unused vacation and sick/personal leave days which is computed on an hourly basis determined by dividing the Employee's current annual salary by 2080 hours. The Severance Benefits means at the City's expense, continued health insurance benefit pursuant to Section 3 of this Agreement equal to (a) of this paragraph.
- c. The value of all accumulated sick leave, vacation time, and other benefits accrued by or credited to the City Employee prior to voluntarily retirement/resignation will be paid to City Employee.
- d. Conditioned upon the City fulfilling its obligations to pay the Severance Amount, the Severance Benefits and the Current Obligations, upon a Unilateral Severance, the Employee waives and releases the Employee's right to continued employment with the City and the parties waive and release the right to an arbitration hearing on the issue of good cause. In the event of a Unilateral Severance, the parties agree not to make disparaging comments or statement about each other.

5. Notices. Any notice required or desired to be given from one party to the other party to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be given and shall be deemed to have been served and received (whether actually received or not) if (i) delivered in person; (ii) deposited in an official depository under the regular care and custody of the United States Postal Service located within the confines of the United States of America sent certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to such party at the address specified; or (iii) address within the confines of the continental United States of America for notice, but until written notice of such change is actually received by the other party, the last address of such party designated for notice shall remain such party's address for notice.

6. Attorney's Fees. The City shall indemnify Employee against expenses (including attorney's fees) and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by her in connection with the defense of any civil, criminal or administrative action, suit or proceeding in which she is made a party or with which she is threatened, by reason of being or because of any act as an Employee of the City within the course and scope of her duties and employment hereunder if she acted in good faith and in a manner in which she reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interest of the City, and with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe her conduct was unlawful. The selection of the Employee's

legal counsel shall be with the mutual agreement of the Employee and the City if such legal counsel is not also the City's legal counsel. A legal defense may be provided for Employee and will depend on the terms of the applicable insurance contract. To the extent this paragraph (Paragraph 6) exceeds the authority provided and limitations imposed by Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code, Chapter 102, it shall be construed and modified accordingly. The provision of this paragraph (Paragraph 6) shall survive the termination, expiration, or other end of this Agreement and/or the Employee's employment with the City

7. **No Assignment.** Neither party shall have the right to assign that party's interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

8. **General Provisions.**

(A) **Complete Agreement.** This Agreement sets forth and establishes the entire understanding between the City and the Employee relating to the employment of the Employee by the City. Any prior discussion or representations by or between the parties are merged into and rendered null and void by this Agreement. The parties by mutual written signed agreement may amend any provision of this Agreement during the term of this Agreement; such amendments shall be incorporated and made a part of this Agreement.

(B) **Binding Effect.** This Agreement shall be binding on the City and the Employee as well as their heirs, assigns, executors, personal representatives and successors in interest.

(C) **Savings Clause.** If any term or provision of this Agreement, as applied to any party or to any circumstance, is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction hereof to be illegal, unenforceable or void in any situation and in any jurisdiction, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining terms and provisions hereof or the validity or enforceability of the offending provision in any other situation or in any other jurisdiction. The parties agree that the court or arbitrator making such provisions, to delete specific words or phrases or to replace any illegal, unenforceable or void term or provision with a term provision that is valid and enforceable and that comes closest to expressing the intention of the invalid or unenforceable term or provision.

(D) **Conflicts.** In the event of any conflict between the terms, conditions and provisions of this Agreement and the Applicable Laws and Authorities, then, unless otherwise prohibited by law, the terms of this Agreement shall take precedence over the contrary provisions of the Applicable Laws and Authorities during the term of this Agreement.

(E) **Controlling Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and shall be performable in Tarrant County, Texas, unless otherwise prohibited by law.

The TARRANT COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT NO. ONE, acting by and through its Board of Emergency Commissioners, hereafter referred to as DISTRICT, and the CITY OF WHITE SETTLEMENT, TEXAS, hereafter referred to as CITY, enter into the following Agreement:

Section 1: Authority and Services

CITY has a volunteer fire department recognized by the Insurance Commission of the State of Texas or a full-time professional fire department, and is, by an order or resolution of its governing body, authorized to enter into this Agreement with DISTRICT for the use of the personnel and equipment of CITY for the purpose of providing fire protection to real and personal property located outside the boundaries of CITY and within such distance as the CITY may be reasonably expected to render service in case of emergency service needs. Said service area(s) is highlighted on the attached Exhibit "A." The equipment and personnel of the CITY shall be under the control and supervision of CITY employees during a fire or emergency medical response pursuant to this Agreement. In accordance with Section 418.109(d) of the Texas Government Code or Section 791.027 of the Texas Government Code, it is also understood and agreed that the existence of this Agreement does not prevent the CITY from providing mutual aid assistance on request from another municipality, county, emergency services district, fire protection agency, organized volunteer group or other emergency service entity, and shall not be obligated to respond, when in the sole judgment of the CITY, such response would leave insufficient protection for the CITY.

Section 2: Fire Services Provided

CITY and DISTRICT hereby agree that for and in consideration of the monies to be paid by DISTRICT to CITY, the CITY will provide, through its fire department, fire protection services to the area described. These services include fire protection, fire rescue and first response for emergency medical services. In the event that the CITY resources are unavailable at the time of the request for services, the CITY will take reasonable efforts to make the resources available as soon as reasonably possible.

Section 3: Fire Service Compensation

DISTRICT agrees to pay to CITY the total sum of FIFTY-TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$52,500.00) during this contract year by making equal quarterly payments during the months of January 2024, April 2024, July 2024 and October 2024 for fire protection services in the service area outlined in Exhibit "A."

Section 4: Term

Regarding payment, this Agreement will be in full force and effect for and during the period beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2024. Regarding response purposes, this Agreement will remain in force until the 2024-25 DISTRICT budget is approved by the Commissioners and a new Agreement is executed retroactive to October 1, 2024 under the same terms and conditions.

Section 5: Payment of Funds

The DISTRICT will use its general fund to pay for the services supplied by the CITY pursuant to this Agreement. Payment pursuant to this Agreement will be in accord with the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Commissioners. Said payments will be made as funds are available to DISTRICT.

Section 6: Emergency Scene Control

Whenever CITY responds to a call outside its normal jurisdictional limits, it will operate under the Fire Code in effect within the CITY limits of such cities or fire department primarily responsible for service to the area being served by CITY. Any fire investigators or other personnel who respond from DISTRICT to a fire or emergency scene which is under the control of CITY will be governed by the Fire Code of the CITY within whose limits the CITY normally operates. CITY personnel agree to fully cooperate with DISTRICT personnel.

Section 7: Inspection of Equipment

The DISTRICT or its agent has the right to inspect the equipment of the CITY that the CITY operates in its performance under this Agreement. The parties acknowledge that the nature of the CITY's equipment determines the consideration paid under this Agreement. In the event that the inspection reveals that the equipment is not in operating condition and in compliance with the Insurance Services Office (ISO) requirements for a department of its size, the CITY will authorize a re-inspection by the DISTRICT within fifteen (15) days. In the event the equipment is not in operating condition or in compliance with the ISO requirements for a department of its size during the re-inspection, all payments by the DISTRICT to the CITY will cease until the problem is corrected as certified by the DISTRICT.

Section 8: Monthly Reporting Required

All monthly reports, fire or ambulance, shall be turned in to the Fire Marshal's office no later than fifteen (15) days after the end of the applicable month. The failure to timely file the monthly report shall excuse the DISTRICT from payment for that applicable month resulting in a reduction of one-third of the quarterly payment to the CITY for each applicable month.

Section 9: Workers' Compensation Coverage

The CITY shall maintain statutory workers' compensation coverage for its employees, officers and volunteers regarding the CITY's performance under this contract. The CITY recognizes that the DISTRICT has no responsibility to furnish this coverage and CITY waives any right to pursue the DISTRICT for liability regarding payments for this coverage or for liability regarding payments for claims filed against this coverage.

Section 10: Line of Duty

When an employee or volunteer of the responding CITY is performing duties under the terms of this Agreement, that person is considered to be acting in the line of duty for the CITY for the purposes of 42 U.S.C.A., Section 3796; is considered to be in performance of duties for the CITY within the applicable provisions of Chapter 615 of the Texas Government Code, and of Chapter 142, Texas Local Government Code; and shall be entitled to any other benefits which accrue under law as a result of injury, death or loss which occurs while in the line of duty for the CITY under this Agreement. This section does not increase the DISTRICT's liability under this Agreement.

Section 11: Assignment of Liability

The assisting party (CITY) shall be responsible for any civil liability or costs that may arise from the fire protection, fire rescue and first response for emergency medical services that the assisting party provides to the requesting party (DISTRICT) under this Agreement. The parties agree pursuant to Section 791.006 (a-1) of the Texas Government Code that assignment of liability provided by this Agreement is intended to be different than liability otherwise assigned under Section 791.006 (a) of the Texas Government Code, which provides that "the governmental unit that would have been responsible for furnishing the services in the absence of the contract is responsible for any civil liability that arises from the furnishing of those services." The parties also agree that pursuant to Section 775.0366 (e) of the Texas Health and Safety Code that assignment of liability provided by this Agreement is intended to be different than liability otherwise assigned under Section 775.0366 (d), which provides that the "district is responsible for any civil liability that arises from furnishing those services if the district would have been responsible for furnishing the services in the absence of the contract." It is expressly understood and agreed, however, that in the execution of this Agreement, neither the CITY nor the DISTRICT waives, nor shall be deemed to waive, any immunity or defenses that would otherwise be available to it against claims arising in the exercise of governmental powers and functions, including the liability limits and immunities for a governmental unit provided by the Texas Tort Claims Act, Chapter 101, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, or other law.

Section 12: Implied Rights; Employees

By entering into this Agreement the parties do not intend to create any obligations expressed or implied other than those specifically set forth herein and this Agreement will not create rights in parties not signatories hereto. The employees of the CITY are not employees or agents of the DISTRICT by virtue of this Agreement. The employees of the DISTRICT are not employees or agents of the CITY by virtue of this Agreement.

Section 13: Conferring of Rights

This Agreement does not confer any rights on third parties who are not signatories to this Agreement, therefore no person may bring suit against CITY or DISTRICT regarding the performance of this Agreement as a third party beneficiary of this Agreement.

Section 14: Cancellation

DISTRICT and CITY retain the right to cancel without cause this Agreement on thirty (30) days written notice to the non-canceling party. In the event of cancellation, DISTRICT will pay a prorated share of the monies due for the remainder of that quarter only if the CITY provides services as required in the Agreement during the period of time leading up to the termination date. However, in the event that CITY exercises this right of cancellation, CITY must repay to DISTRICT all money paid CITY by DISTRICT for personal property, if any, purchased by the CITY with funds from the DISTRICT.

Section 15: Form 1295 Acknowledgement

CITY acknowledges that it is a governmental entity and not a business entity as those terms are defined in Section 2252.908 of the Texas Government Code, and therefore, no disclosure of interested parties pursuant to Section 2252.908 of the Texas Government Code is required.

Section 16: Grant from District

During the DISTRICT's 2024 fiscal year, the CITY may request reimbursement for expenses related to the item(s) listed in Exhibit "D". Reimbursement shall not exceed the amounts or quantities listed unless specifically authorized by the DISTRICT through an action of its Commissioners. Reimbursement requests must be received by the DISTRICT on or before June 30, 2024. Reimbursements will be considered based on proper documentation being submitted by the CITY including, but not limited to, an itemized invoice(s) and proof of payment(s) by the CITY.

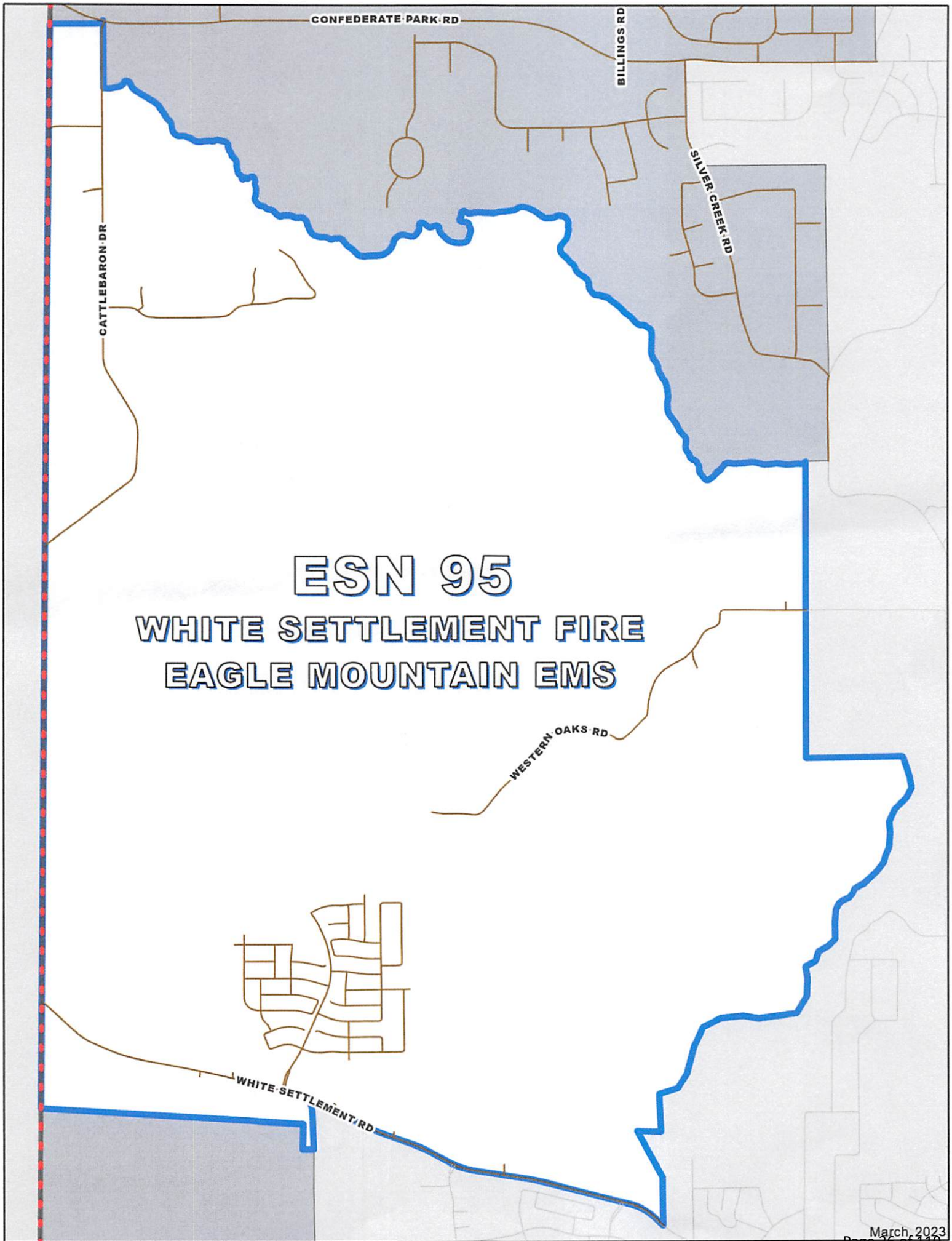

JOINT ELECTION AGREEMENT AND CONTRACT FOR ELECTION SERVICES

THIS CONTRACT for election services is made by and between the Tarrant County Elections Administrator and the following political subdivisions located entirely or partially inside the boundaries of Tarrant County:

The Tarrant County Elections Administrator and the political subdivisions mentioned above may be collectively referred to as "Parties" or individually as a "Party".

This Contract is made pursuant to Texas Election Code Sections 31.092 and 271.002 – 271.004, if applicable, and Texas Education Code Section 11.0581 for a joint November 7, 2023 election to be administered by the undersigned Tarrant County Elections Administrator, hereinafter referred to as "Elections Administrator." This term includes the Assistant Elections Administrator in the Elections Administrator's absence or disability.

RECITALS

Each Participating Authority listed above plans to hold a general and/or special election on November 7, 2023. If a run-off election or a repeat election is necessary because of legal action, the date of that election will be December 9, 2023.

The County owns an electronic voting system, the Hart InterCivic Verity Voting System (Version 2.7), which has been duly approved by the Secretary of State pursuant to Texas Election Code Chapter 122, as amended, and is compliant with the accessibility requirements for persons with disabilities set forth by Texas Election Code Section 61.012. The contracting political subdivisions, also known interchangeably as "Entities" or "Participating Authority(ies)", desire to use the County's electronic voting system and to compensate the County for such use and to share in certain other expenses connected with joint elections in accordance with the applicable provisions of Chapters 31 and 271 of the Texas Election Code, as amended. The entity desires to contract for the voting system as described, in tandem with the County's elections services through the Elections Administrator's office, and to compensate the County for such use and to share in other expenses connected with joint elections in accordance with the applicable provisions of law and of this contract.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, agreements, and benefits to the Parties, IT IS AGREED as follows:

I. ADMINISTRATION

The Parties agree to hold a joint election with each other ("Joint Election") in accordance with Chapter 271 of the Texas Election Code and this Agreement. The Tarrant County Elections Administrator shall coordinate, supervise, and handle all aspects of administering the Joint Election as provided in this Agreement. Each Participating Authority agrees to pay the Tarrant County Elections Administrator for equipment, supplies, services, and administrative costs as provided in this Agreement. The Tarrant County Elections Administrator shall serve as the administrator for the Joint Election; however, each Participating Authority shall remain responsible for the decisions and actions of its officers necessary for the lawful conduct of its election. The Elections Administrator shall provide advisory services in connection with decisions to be made and actions to be taken by the officers of each Participating Authority as necessary. Legal advice to or legal representation of the Entities/Political Subdivisions/Participating Authorities by the Election Administrator's office or lawyers who advise or

represent the Election Administrator is not included herewith; each Entity should consult with its own counsel for any legal issues that arise, or with the Texas Secretary of State, as appropriate.

It is understood that other political subdivisions may wish to participate in the use of the County's electronic voting system and polling places, and it is agreed that the Elections Administrator may enter into other contracts for election services for those purposes on terms and conditions generally similar to those set forth in this Contract. In such cases, costs shall be pro-rated among the participants according to Section XI of this Contract.

Each Participating Authority agrees to adopt the Verity Voting System v. 2.7, from HART InterCivic, as the Voting System for this election, so that it may be used, in accordance with the terms and conditions specified in the certification order issued by the Texas Secretary of State, for all forms of voting, including election day voting at polling locations, early voting in person, early voting by mail, and provisional voting.

At each polling location, joint participants shall share voting equipment and supplies to the extent possible. The Participating Authorities shall share a mutual ballot in those polling places where jurisdictions overlap. However, in no instance shall a voter be permitted to receive a ballot containing an office or proposition stating a measure on which the voter is ineligible to vote. Multiple ballot styles shall be available in those shared polling places where jurisdictions do not overlap.

II. LEGAL DOCUMENTS

Each Participating Authority shall be responsible for the preparation, adoption, and publication of all required election orders, resolutions, notices, and any other pertinent documents required by the Texas Election Code and/or the Participating Authority's governing body, charter, or ordinances, except that the Elections Administrator shall be responsible for the preparation and publication of all voting system testing notices that are required by the Texas Election Code.

Preparation of the necessary materials for notices and the official ballot shall be the responsibility of each Participating Authority, including translation to languages other than English, including (but not necessarily limited to), as required by law, Spanish and Vietnamese. Each Participating Authority shall provide a copy of their respective election orders and notices to the Tarrant County Elections Administrator.

III. VOTING LOCATIONS

The Elections Administrator shall select and arrange for the use of and payment for all Election Day voting locations. Voting locations will be, whenever possible, the usual voting location for each election precinct in elections conducted by each participating city, and shall be compliant with the accessibility requirements established by Election Code Section 43.034 and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The proposed voting locations are listed in Attachment A of this Agreement. In the event that a voting location is not available or appropriate, the Elections Administrator will arrange for use of an alternate location with the approval of the affected Participating Authorities. The Elections Administrator shall notify the Participating Authorities of any changes from the locations listed in Attachment A.

If polling places for the November 7, 2023 joint election are different from the polling place(s) used by a Participating Authority in its most recent election, the authority agrees to post a notice no later than November 7, 2023 at the entrance to any previous polling places in the jurisdiction stating that the polling location has changed and stating the political subdivision's polling place names and addresses in effect for the November 7, 2023 election. This notice shall be written in both the English, Spanish, and Vietnamese languages.

IV. ELECTION JUDGES, CLERKS, AND OTHER ELECTION PERSONNEL

Tarrant County shall be responsible for the appointment of the presiding judge and alternate judge for each polling location. The Elections Administrator shall make emergency appointments of election officials if necessary.

Upon request by the Elections Administrator, each Participating Authority agrees to assist in recruiting polling place officials who are bilingual [(fluent in both English and Spanish) and (fluent in both English and Vietnamese)]. In compliance with the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, each polling place containing more than 5% Hispanic or Vietnamese population as determined by the most recent Census used for such determinations shall have one or more election officials who are fluent in both English and Spanish, or both English and Vietnamese, as applicable. If a presiding

judge is not bilingual, and is unable to appoint a bilingual clerk, the Elections Administrator may recommend a bilingual worker for the polling place. If the Elections Administrator is unable to recommend or recruit a bilingual worker, the Participating Authority or authorities served by that polling place shall be responsible for recruiting a bilingual worker for interpretation and translation services as needed at that polling place.

The Elections Administrator shall notify all election judges of the eligibility requirements of Subchapter C of Chapter 32 of the Texas Election Code and will take the necessary steps to ensure that all election judges appointed for the Joint Election are eligible to serve.

The Elections Administrator shall arrange for the training and compensation of all election judges and clerks. The Elections Administrator shall arrange for the date, time, and place for presiding election judges to pick up their election supplies. Each presiding election judge will be sent a letter from the Elections Administrator notifying the judge of the appointment, the time and location of training and distribution of election supplies, and the number of election clerks that the presiding judge may appoint.

Each election judge and clerk will receive compensation at the hourly rate established by Tarrant County pursuant to Texas Election Code Section 32.091 or other law applicable to compensation for the election-related work. The election judge will receive an additional sum of \$25.00 for picking up the election supplies prior to Election Day and for returning the supplies and equipment to the central counting station after the polls close.

Election judges and clerks who attend voting equipment training and/or procedures training shall be compensated at the same hourly rate that they are to be paid on Election Day.

The Elections Administrator may employ other personnel necessary for the proper administration of the election, including such part-time help as is necessary to prepare for the election, to ensure the timely delivery of supplies during early voting and on Election Day, and for the efficient tabulation of ballots at the central counting station. Part-time personnel working as members of the Early Voting Ballot Board and/or central counting station on election night will be compensated at the hourly rate set by Tarrant County in accordance with Election Code Sections 87.005, 127.004, and 127.006.

V. PREPARATION OF SUPPLIES AND VOTING EQUIPMENT

The Elections Administrator shall arrange for all election supplies and voting equipment including, but not limited to, official ballots, sample ballots, voter registration lists, and all forms, signs, maps and other materials used by the election judges at the voting locations. The Elections Administrator shall ensure availability of tables and chairs at each polling place and shall procure rented tables and chairs for those polling places that do not have tables and/or chairs.

The Elections Administrator shall provide the necessary voter registration information, maps, instructions, and other information needed to enable the election judges in the voting locations that have more than one ballot style to conduct a proper election.

Each Participating Authority shall furnish the Elections Administrator a list of candidates and/or propositions showing the order and the exact manner in which the candidate names and/or proposition(s) are to appear on the official ballot (including titles and text in each language in which the authority's ballot is to be printed). Each Participating Authority shall be responsible for proofreading and approving the ballot insofar as it pertains to that authority's candidates and/or propositions.

The joint election ballots that contain ballot content for more than one joint participant because of overlapping territory shall be arranged in the following order: Independent School District, City, Water District(s), College District, and other political subdivisions.

The Elections Administrator shall be responsible for the preparation, testing, and delivery of the voting equipment for the election, as required by the Election Code.

The Elections Administrator shall conduct criminal background checks on relevant employees upon hiring as required by Election Code Section 129.051(g).

VI. EARLY VOTING

The Participating Authorities agree to conduct joint early voting and to appoint the Election Administrator as the Early Voting Clerk in accordance with Sections 31.097 and 271.006 of the Texas Election Code. Each Participating Authority agrees to appoint the Elections Administrator's permanent county employees as deputy early voting clerks. The Participating Authorities further agree that the Elections Administrator may appoint other deputy early voting clerks to assist in the conduct of early voting as necessary, and that these additional deputy early voting clerks shall be compensated at an hourly rate set by Tarrant County pursuant to Section 83.052 of the Texas Election Code. Deputy early voting clerks and election day workers who are permanent employees of the Tarrant County Elections Administrator or any Participating Authority and whose regular or additional duties as assigned by their employer include working as a deputy early voting clerk or election day worker shall serve in that capacity without additional compensation. Deputy early voting clerks and election day workers, including but not limited to election judges, who are not permanent employees of the Tarrant County Elections Administrator and whose job duties for a Participating Authority do not include being a deputy early voting clerk or an election day worker may, if not otherwise prohibited by law, contract with the company that provides temporary contract personnel for these positions. Contract workers are not Tarrant County employees. Such a contracting person will be paid as a contract worker for those duties and may work under contract when they are not on-duty in their regular job for the Participating Authority. Double-dipping shall be prohibited: for any particular hours of work, a person cannot both be considered working for a Participating Authority and also at work under contract as a deputy early voting clerk or election day worker. Whether such a contracting person may be paid benefit time as an off-duty employee of a Participating Authority (such as vacation, personal, or other paid time off) is subject to the rules of the person's employer. No person may contract to work elections as an election judge or clerk, or a deputy election clerk, if the person is employed by or related within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity as determined by Chapter 573, Government Code, to an opposed candidate for a public office that appears on the ballot in the election at which the person is working. For purposes of this, a candidate whose name appears on the ballot is not considered to be opposed by a write-in candidate other than a declared write-in candidate under Chapter 146, Election Code.

Early Voting by personal appearance will be held at the locations, dates, and times listed in Attachment "B" of this document. Any qualified voter of the Joint Election may vote early by personal appearance at any of the joint early voting locations.

As Early Voting Clerk, the Elections Administrator shall receive applications for early voting ballots to be voted by mail in accordance with Chapters 31 and 86 of the Texas Election Code. Any requests for early voting ballots to be voted by mail received by the Participating Authorities shall be forwarded immediately by fax or courier to the Elections Administrator for processing. The Elections Administrator will be responsible for managing the Annual Ballot by Mail voters for whom the Elections Administrator has received an Application for Ballot by Mail, including maintaining and making available the early voting roster information in conformance with Section 87.121 of the Texas Election Code. Upon request of a participating authority, the Early Voting Clerk will promptly make all information contained within the early voting roster available for inspection by the participating authority, including the information maintained under Section 87.121(f). The Participating Authorities understand that, as specified in section 87.121, information on the roster for a person to whom an early voting mail ballot has been sent is not available for public inspection, except to the voter seeking to verify that the information pertaining to the voter is accurate, until the first business day after election day.

In addition to making the information on the roster for a person who votes an early voting ballot by personal appearance available for public inspection not later than the beginning of the regular business hours on the day after the date the information is entered on the roster, the Elections Administrator shall post on the county website each Participating Authority's early voting report on a daily basis and a cumulative final early voting report following the close of early voting. In accordance with Section 87.121(g) of the Election Code, the daily reports showing the previous day's early voting activity will be posted to the county website no later than 10:00 AM each business day.

VII. EARLY VOTING BALLOT BOARD AND SIGNATURE VERIFICATION COMMITTEE

Tarrant County shall appoint an Early Voting Ballot Board (EVBB) to process early voting results from the Joint Election. The Presiding Judge, with the assistance of the Elections Administrator, shall appoint two or more additional members to constitute the EVBB. The Elections Administrator shall determine the number of EVBB members required to efficiently process the early voting ballots.

The Elections Administrator shall determine whether a Signature Verification Committee is necessary, and if so, shall appoint the members.

VIII. CENTRAL COUNTING STATION AND ELECTION RETURNS

The Elections Administrator shall be responsible for establishing and operating the central and remote counting stations to receive and tabulate the voted ballots in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code and of this Agreement.

The Participating Authorities hereby, in accordance with Section 127.002, 127.003, and 127.005 of the Texas Election Code, appoint the following central counting station officials:

Counting Station Manager:	Clint Ludwig, Elections Administrator
Tabulation Supervisor:	Stacey Behymer, Technology Resources Coordinator
Presiding Judge:	David Lambertsen

The Counting Station Manager or his/her representative shall deliver timely cumulative reports of the election results as precinct report to the central and remote counting stations and are tabulated. The Counting Station Manager shall be responsible for releasing unofficial cumulative totals and precinct returns from the election to the joint participants, candidates, press, and general public by distribution of hard copies at the central counting station or by electronic distribution and by posting to the Tarrant County web site. To ensure the accuracy of reported election returns, results printed on the tapes produced by Tarrant County's voting equipment will not be released to the Participating Authorities at the remote collection sites or by phone from individual polling locations.

The Elections Administrator will prepare the unofficial canvass reports that are necessary for compliance with Election Code Section 67.004 after all precincts have been counted and will deliver a copy of these unofficial canvass reports to each Participating Authority as soon as possible after all returns have been tabulated. Each Participating Authority shall be responsible for the official canvass of its respective election(s).

The Elections Administrator will prepare the electronic precinct-by-precinct results reports for uploading to the Secretary of State as required by Section 67.017 of the Election Code. The Elections Administrator agrees to upload these reports for each Participating Authority unless requested otherwise.

The Elections Administrator shall be responsible for conducting the post-election manual recount required by Section 127.201 of the Texas Election Code unless a waiver is granted by the Secretary of State. Notification and copies of the recount, if waiver is denied, will be provided to each Participating Authority and the Secretary of State's Office.

IX. PARTICIPATING AUTHORITIES WITH TERRITORY OUTSIDE TARRANT COUNTY

Each Participating Authority with territory containing population outside Tarrant County agrees that the Elections Administrator shall administer only the Tarrant County portion of those elections.

X. RUNOFF ELECTIONS

Each Participating Authority shall have the option of extending the terms of this Agreement through its runoff election, if applicable. In the event of such runoff election, the terms of this Agreement shall automatically extend unless the Participating Authority notifies the Elections Administrator in writing within three (3) business days after the original election, not counting election day.

Each Participating Authority shall reserve the right to reduce the number of early voting locations and/or Election Day voting locations in a runoff election.

Each Participating Authority agrees to order any runoff election(s) at its meeting for canvassing the votes from the November 7, 2023 election.

Each Participating Authority eligible to hold runoff elections agrees that the date of the runoff election, if necessary, shall be December 9, 2023.

XI. ELECTION EXPENSES AND ALLOCATION OF COSTS

The Participating Authorities agree to share the costs of administering the Joint Election. Allocation of costs, unless specifically stated otherwise, is mutually agreed to be shared according to a formula which is based on the average cost per Election Day polling place (unit cost) as determined by adding together the overall expenses and dividing the expenses equally among the total number of polling places. Costs for polling places shared by more than one Participating Authority shall be pro-rated equally among the participants utilizing that polling place.

It is agreed that charges for Election Day judges and clerks and Election Day polling place rental fees shall be directly charged to the appropriate Participating Authority rather than averaging those costs among all participants.

Costs for Voting by Personal Appearance shall be allocated based upon the actual costs associated with each voting site. Each Participating Authority shall be responsible for a pro-rata portion of the actual costs associated with the voting sites located within their jurisdiction. Participating authorities that do not have a voting site within their jurisdiction shall pay a pro-rata portion of the nearest regular early voting site.

Costs for Early Voting by Mail shall be allocated according to the actual number of ballots mailed to each Participating Authority's voters.

Participating Authorities having the majority of their voters in another county, and fewer than 500 registered voters in Tarrant County, and that do not have an Election Day polling place or early voting site within their jurisdiction shall pay a flat fee of \$400 for election expenses.

Each Participating Authority agrees to pay the Tarrant County Elections Administrator an administrative fee equal to ten percent (10%) of its total billable costs (but not less than \$ 75.00) in accordance with Section 31.100(d) of the Texas Election Code.

The Tarrant County Elections Administrator shall deposit all funds payable under this Contract into the appropriate fund(s) within the county treasury in accordance with Election Code Section 31.100.

Cost schedule and invoicing.

A cost estimate for the services, equipment, and supplies provided by the Elections Administrator for the election and the runoff election is shown below and in section XII of this Agreement. This cost estimate shall serve as the cost schedule agreed upon by the contracting Parties, as referenced in Section 31.093(a), Texas Election Code.

As soon as reasonably possible after the election or the runoff election, the Elections Administrator will submit an itemized invoice to each Party: (i) for the actual expenses he/she incurred as described above and (ii) for the Elections Administrator's fee as described above. The invoice shall reflect any advance monies paid and any direct payments made. The Elections Administrator will use his/her best efforts to submit the invoice within thirty (30) days after the election or within ten (10) days after the runoff election.

The Elections Administrator's invoice shall be due and payable by each Party to the address set forth in the invoice within thirty (30) days after its receipt by the Party. If the Party disputes any portion of the invoice, the Party shall notify the Elections Administrator in writing within such thirty-day period, or the invoice will be presumed to be a true and accurate rendering of the amount that is due.

XII. COST ESTIMATES AND DEPOSIT OF FUNDS

The total estimated obligation for each Participating Authority under the terms of this Agreement is listed below. Each Participating Authority agrees to pay the Tarrant County Elections Administrator a deposit of approximately 75% of this estimated obligation within fifteen (15) days after execution of this Agreement. The exact amount of each Participating Authority's obligation under the terms of this Agreement shall be calculated after the November 7, 2023 election (or runoff election, if applicable), and if the amount of an authority's total obligation exceeds the amount deposited, the authority shall pay to the Elections Administrator the balance due within thirty (30) days after the receipt of the final invoice from the Elections Administrator. However, if the amount of the authority's total obligation is less than the amount deposited, the

Elections Administrator shall refund to the authority the excess amount paid within thirty (30) days after the final costs are calculated.

The total estimated obligation and required deposit for each Participating Authority under the terms of this Agreement shall be as follows:

XIII. WITHDRAWAL FROM CONTRACT DUE TO CANCELLATION OF ELECTION

Any Participating Authority may withdraw from this Agreement and the Joint Election should it cancel its election in accordance with Sections 2.051 - 2.053 of the Texas Election Code. The withdrawing authority is fully liable for any expenses incurred by the Tarrant County Elections Administrator on behalf of the authority plus an administrative fee of ten percent (10%) of such expenses (but not less than \$ 75.00). Any monies deposited with the Elections Administrator by the withdrawing authority shall be refunded, minus the aforementioned expenses and administrative fee if applicable.

It is agreed that any of the joint election early voting sites that are not within the boundaries of one or more of the remaining Participating Authorities, with the exception of the early voting site located at the Tarrant County Elections Center, may be dropped from the joint election unless one or more of the remaining Participating Authorities agree to fully fund such site(s). In the event that any early voting site is eliminated under this section, an addendum to the Contract shall be provided to the remaining participants within five days after notification of all intents to withdraw have been received by the Elections Administrator.

XIV. RECORDS OF THE ELECTION

The Elections Administrator is hereby appointed general custodian of the voted ballots and all records of the Joint Election as authorized by Section 271.010 of the Texas Election Code.

Access to the election records shall be available to each Participating Authority as well as to the public in accordance with applicable provisions of the Texas Election Code and the Texas Public Information Act. The election records shall be stored at the offices of the Elections Administrator or at an alternate facility used for storage of county records. The Elections Administrator shall ensure that the records are maintained in an orderly manner so that the records are clearly identifiable and retrievable.

Records of the election shall be retained and disposed of in accordance with the provisions of Section 66.058 of the Texas Election Code. If records of the election are involved in any pending election contest, investigation, litigation, or public information request, the Elections Administrator shall maintain the records until final resolution or until final judgment, whichever is applicable. It is the responsibility of each Participating Authority to bring to the attention of the Elections Administrator any notice of pending election contest, investigation, litigation or public information request which may be filed with the Participating Authority.

XV. RECOUNTS

A recount may be obtained as provided by Title 13 of the Texas Election Code. By signing this document, the presiding officer of the contracting Participating Authority agrees that any recount shall take place at the offices of the Elections Administrator, and that the Elections Administrator shall serve as Recount Supervisor and the Participating Authority's official or employee who performs the duties of a secretary under the Texas Election Code shall serve as Recount Coordinator.

The Elections Administrator agrees to provide advisory services to each Participating Authority as necessary to conduct a proper recount.

XVI. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

1. It is understood that to the extent space is available, other districts and political subdivisions may wish to participate in the use of the County's election equipment and voting places, and it is agreed that the Elections Administrator may contract with such other districts or political subdivisions for such purposes and that in such event there may be an adjustment of the pro-rata share to be paid to the County by the Participating Authorities.
2. The Elections Administrator shall file copies of this document with the Tarrant County Judge and the Tarrant County Auditor in accordance with Section 31.099 of the Texas Election Code.
3. Nothing in this Contract prevents any Party from taking appropriate legal action against any other Party and/or other election personnel for a breach of this Contract or a violation of the Texas Election Code.
4. This Agreement shall be construed under and in accord with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the Parties created hereunder are performable in Tarrant County, Texas.
5. In the event that one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.
6. All Parties shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, and codes of the State of Texas, all local governments, and any other entities with local jurisdiction.
7. The waiver by any party of a breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not operate as or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach.
8. Any Amendments of this Agreement shall be of no effect unless in writing and signed by all Parties hereto.
9. In the event of an emergency or unforeseen event on Election Day that requires adjustment to these procedures to keep the election operating in a timely, fair, and accessible manner, Elections Administrator may make such adjustments to the procedures herein as the circumstances require.

ISSUE

The City of White Settlement is requesting permission to approve an Interlocal Assistance Agreement with the Tarrant County Regional Auto Crimes Task Force Agency (TCRACTFA).

DISCUSSION

The police department, in consultation with the City Manager's Office, has been approved for grant funding through the state of Texas and Tarrant County to assign a full time equivalent (FTE) sworn officer to the auto theft task force, formally known as the TCRACTFA. As reported in the department's annual report for 2022, the city experienced a 9% increase in auto thefts (87 thefts as compared to 78 in 2021). As a member of this task force, our city will get access to more investigators and resources to combat auto thefts and crimes that involve cars.

The agreement provides 80% reimbursement of salary and fringe (benefits) for an average tenured criminal investigator. The agreement also authorizes overtime expenditures of up to 5% of the salary. The police department will fund 20% of the salary and cover any excess overtime expenditures beyond the 5% (which is not expected to occur).

ACTION

The police department would recommend approval of the Interlocal Assistance Agreement with Tarrant County.

COSTS

Investigator Salary of 20% budgeted in personnel line item and approved by City Council.

The Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force Agency Interlocal Assistance Agreement (ILA) has been prepared for the FY24 grant and attached to this email correspondence. We request that a minimum of two originals be printed and signed at the conclusion of your city's approval process. Once the appropriate approvals and signatures are affixed, **please contact us so we can arrange to pick up the documents avoiding mailing delays and expediting the process.** All agency originals will be submitted to the Tarrant County Commissioners Court and a fully executed original will be returned to you. Please feel free to make additional originals if necessary.

There were no substantive changes made to this year's ILA as compared to FY23 aside from language articulating the addition of the four new agencies (Grapevine, Weatherford, White Settlement, and Wise County) and the resulting effect on the Board of Governor's composition. Tarrant County will reimburse eighty percent (80%) percent of salary and fringe and authorized Task Force overtime is budgeted up to five percent (5%) of the salary. The budget figures contained in your respective ILA were based on the salary and fringe projection calculated for an average tenured criminal investigator position submitted by your agency in April that was included in the FY24 grant application and approved by the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority (MVCPA). Future ILAs will be updated to reflect the specific salary of your assigned investigator.

Please provide a minimum of two signed agreements as soon as possible as grant reimbursements to our participating agencies may only be submitted once all executed ILAs are in-hand. We are attempting to include signed agency ILAs on the next Commissioners Court agenda that is due by noon on September 19th.

**THE TARRANT REGIONAL AUTO CRIMES
TASK FORCE INTERLOCAL ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT**

WHEREAS the detection, apprehension, and prosecution of individuals who commit motor vehicle crimes (defined herein as “motor vehicle theft, burglary of a motor vehicle, and fraud-related motor vehicle crime”) is often hindered because the range of operations of the criminal offender is greater than the jurisdiction of the peace officers called upon to investigate the crime; and,

WHEREAS the existence of a multiplicity of political jurisdictions in Tarrant, Jack, Hood, Palo Pinto, Parker, Somervell, and Wise Counties impedes the effectiveness of individual law enforcement agencies to detect and eradicate automobile-related crimes; and,

WHEREAS past experience has indicated that a cooperative effort between law enforcement agencies and Tarrant County has been effective in detecting and deterring the activities of targeted criminal groups to the mutual benefit of all the political entities of Tarrant County and neighboring counties; and,

WHEREAS pursuant to Chapter 362 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, Texas Administrative Code, Title 43; Part 3; Chapter 57 and Chapter 1006 of the Texas Transportation Code, the contracting governmental entities, to-wit: Arlington, Euless, Fort Worth, Grapevine, Haltom City, Hurst, Lake Worth, Weatherford, White Settlement, the County of Parker, the County of Tarrant, and the County of Wise, together with the Tarrant County Criminal District Attorney and the Tarrant County Sheriff, hereby agree to participate in, and be a part of the cooperative investigative, enforcement, and prevention efforts which are known and designated as the Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force; and,

WHEREAS each of the contracting governmental entities makes the following findings:

- a. This Agreement serves the common interests of all parties;
- b. This Agreement will benefit the public;
- c. The division of costs fairly compensates all parties to this Agreement; and
- d. Each entity has authorized its representative to sign this Agreement;
- e. Each entity acknowledges that it is a “governmental entity” and not a “business entity” as those terms are defined in Tex. Gov’t Code § 2252.908, and therefore, no disclosure of interested parties pursuant to Tex. Gov’t Code Section 2252.908 is required;

and,

WHEREAS, during the performance of the governmental functions and the payment for the performance of those governmental functions under this Agreement, the

parties will make the performance and payment from current revenues legally available to that party; and

WHEREAS a grant of money from the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority has been received to fund the continuation of the Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT KNOWN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That Tarrant County, acting by and through its duly authorized County Judge, the Criminal District Attorney of Tarrant County, the Sheriff of Tarrant County, and the governmental entities that have executed, are executing, or will execute substantially similar copies hereof at this time or in the future during the time that this Agreement is in force, acting herein by and through their duly authorized chief administrative officer, do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

TASK FORCE

The Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force ("Task Force") will be a part of the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office for administrative purposes. The activities of the Task Force shall be supervised by a fourteen (14) member Board of Governors. This Board will include as permanent voting members the Fort Worth Chief of Police, the Arlington Chief of Police, the Tarrant County Criminal District Attorney, and a Chairperson, who shall be the Tarrant County Sheriff. Additionally, the Board will consist of an executive of every additional agency that participates in the Task Force with personnel, to include: The Police Chiefs of Euless, Grapevine, Haltom City, Hurst, Lake Worth, Weatherford, White Settlement, the Parker County Sheriff, the Wise County Sheriff, and a Regional Director of the National Insurance Crime Bureau. Ex-officio members, if any, may be added by agreement of the voting members; ex-officio members shall be non-voting. The Board of Governors shall have the responsibility for policy, direction, and control of the Task Force. The Board of Governors will have direct responsibility for the selection of a Commander for the Task Force. The Board will monitor the activities and accomplishments of the Task Force to ensure orderly progress towards attainment of all stated objectives.

There will be one unit, which may form sub-groups or teams as appropriate. The activities and investigations of these sub-groups or teams shall be led by the Sgt. Team Leader at the direction of the Commander of the Task Force. These sub-groups or teams will have the duties assigned to them by the Sgt. Team Leader at the approval of the Commander.

AUTOMOBILE RELATED CRIMES INVESTIGATIONS

Automobile-related crimes investigations within the jurisdictional bounds of the entities joining this Agreement may be coordinated through the Task Force. All commercial auto crimes intelligence received by a law enforcement agency that is a party to this Agreement may be referred to the Task Force for investigation. The assigned officers will respond to complaints in a timely manner. The Task Force will conduct salvage business inspections, covert operations, training, arrests, investigations, assistance to other agencies and public awareness education in an effort to lower the auto crimes rate.

ASSET SEIZURES

All asset seizures developed by the Task Force in Tarrant County under Chapter 59 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, as well as any criminal acts, will be prosecuted by the Tarrant County Criminal District Attorney's Office.

There is hereby created a certain fund to be known as the Auto Crimes Task Force Asset Seizure Fund (hereinafter called "Fund"), said Fund to be created in compliance with State law and the requirements of the grant restrictions.

FORFEITURE POLICY

Upon entry of a judgment in a judicial proceeding awarding monies or other proceeds to the Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force, said monies or proceeds will be immediately deposited in the Auto Crimes Task Force Seizure Fund. The monies and proceeds in this Fund must be used to further the purpose of the Task Force as required by the Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force Grant award: Enhancement of currently funded and/or future automobile-related crimes enforcement and prevention programs.

All forfeiture funds and other generated program income shall be subject to audit by the Auditor of Tarrant County, Texas, and the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority.

Any conveyance or vehicle that is the subject of a final forfeiture shall be awarded to the Task Force to be used to further the purpose of the Task Force as required by the Task Force grant award.

Upon termination of this Agreement, ownership of equipment, hardware, and other non-expendable items will revert to the applicant for which it was acquired, subject to the approval of the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority of the State of Texas.

OFFICER STATUS

Any peace officer assigned to the Task Force by a government entity which is a party to this Agreement shall be empowered to enforce all laws and ordinances applicable in the jurisdiction of the county and municipal entities signatory to this Agreement, including the power to make arrests, execute search warrants, and investigate auto crimes offenses outside of the geographical jurisdiction from which he or she is assigned, but within the area covered by the jurisdictions of the counties and municipal entities which are parties to this Agreement.

While functioning as a peace officer assigned to the Task Force, he or she shall have all of the law enforcement powers of a regular peace officer of such other political entity.

A peace officer who is assigned, designated, or ordered by the official designated by the governing body of any entity to perform law enforcement duties as a member of the Task Force shall receive the same wage, salary, pension and all other compensation and all other rights for such service, including injury or death benefits and workers' compensation benefits, paid in accordance with the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority Grant Guidelines, as existing or as may be amended, and applicable law, as though the service had been rendered within the limits of the entity from which he or she was assigned. Recognizing the benefits to a participating entity to this agreement, it is agreed that all wage and disability payments, including workers' compensation benefits, pension payments, damage to equipment (with the exception of leased vehicles, for which damages will be covered under the provisions of the lease(s) and clothing,

medical expense and expense of travel, food and lodging shall be paid in accordance with the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority Grant Guidelines, as existing or as may be amended. However, peace officers assigned to the Task Force will not work overtime that is not reimbursable to their assigning agency without prior approval from their assigning agency supervisor. (For example, Fort Worth police officers assigned to the Task Force will not work Task Force overtime, which is not reimbursable to the Fort Worth Police Department, without prior approval from their Fort Worth police supervisor.) Instead, they will be permitted to flex their work hours as necessary to accomplish Task Force objectives and assignments.

In further recognition of the benefit to be gained by the entity participating in the Task Force, it is agreed that no entity that is a party to this Agreement shall receive or be entitled to reimbursement from another entity participating in this Agreement for any services performed pursuant to this Agreement.

It is further agreed that, in the event that any peace officer assigned to the Task Force is cited as a party defendant to any civil lawsuit, state or federal, arising out of his or her official acts while functioning as a peace officer assigned to the Task Force, said peace officer shall be entitled to the same benefits that such officer would be entitled to receive had such civil action arisen out of an official act within the scope of his or her duties as a member and in the jurisdiction of the law enforcement agency from which he or she was assigned. Further, no entity shall be responsible for the acts of a peace officer of another entity assigned to the Task Force. Each entity participating herein indemnifies and holds all other participating entities harmless for all acts of its own officers and employees acting hereunder, to the full extent permitted by law.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

This Contract is subject to all grant conditions applicable to the grant of the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority to the Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force.

Each party to this Agreement expressly waives all claims against every other party for compensation for any loss, damage, personal injury, or death occurring as a consequence of the performance of this Agreement.

Third party claims against members shall be governed by the Texas Tort Claims Act or other appropriate statutes and laws of the State of Texas and the United States.

It is expressly understood and agreed that, in the execution of this Agreement, no party waives, nor shall be deemed hereby to waive, any immunity or defense that would otherwise be available to it against claims arising in the exercise of governmental powers and functions.

The validity of this Agreement and of any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties hereunder, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas.

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

This Agreement shall become effective as to a party hereto on the day of the *execution of the Agreement by the party and shall continue in effect as to a participating entity for one year from the date of signature and thereafter until it has been terminated or rescinded by appropriate action of the participating entity's governing body, or expires due to termination of the grant or by operation of law.* (To minimize the administrative difficulty of signature between the many parties, each city or other law enforcement entity will sign a substantially similar agreement with Tarrant County; however, each party signing substantially similar copies is immediately bound one to another to all other entities participating during the time said agreement is in force as to said entity, even though the parties' signatures appear on different copies of the substantially similar copies. Any entity being added after the agreement is in effect need only sign the documents which Tarrant County signs to be fully a party bound to all other parties, and such signature shall, as of the date of the signing, have the same force and effect as between the joining and already-bound members as if a single document was signed simultaneously by all then-participating entities.)

If program enhancement activities are terminated, unexpended revenues will be promptly returned to the Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority.

This Agreement may be amended or modified by the mutual agreement of the parties hereto in writing. The Interlocal Agreement is for the period and on the conditions herein contained, and on such conditions to this Agreement as may be added by amendment or by law, and not for any period beyond that permitted by law, nor for any purpose not permitted by law.

This instrument contains all commitments and agreements of the parties, and no oral or written commitments have any force or effect to alter any term or condition of this Agreement, unless the same are done in proper form and in a manner constituting a bona fide amendment hereto.

The National Insurance Crime Bureau, a non-local entity, will enter a separate agreement with Tarrant County for the following reasons: The entity's staff member carries a statewide law enforcement commission and therefore does not require the enhanced law enforcement jurisdiction afforded by this Agreement; The entity funds their staff member's salary and fringe benefits 100%; and the entity's staff member performs in a support role to the Task Force and is available less than 100% of their work week because the availability of the staff member is subject to assignments from their entity.

The parties agree that their collective agreement may be evidenced by the execution of an identical counterpart of this instrument by the duly authorized official(s) of each participant and the failure of any anticipated member to enter into or renew this Agreement shall not affect the agreement between and among the parties executing the Agreement.

BUDGETARY MATTERS

As part of this Agreement, all participating entities entitled to reimbursement will be reimbursed for their participation in this program by grant funds, according to the entity's applicable submitted budget schedule, to the extent that the budget schedule is consistent with the grant. Reimbursement will be made through the grant's financial officer, who is presently Kimberly M. Buchanan, Auditor, Tarrant County, but is subject to change by Tarrant County. If changed, the change will be made in accordance with the

grant and all participating entities will be advised in writing. To the extent that the budget schedule is inconsistent with the grant, the grant controls. *A copy of the latest and most current Grant Award Digest will be provided to all participating agencies when received by Tarrant County.* Participating entities may bill the financial officer for reimbursement at such periodic intervals as are appropriate and in accordance with the grant.

As consideration for this agreement, Tarrant County (“**Grantee**”) agrees to reimburse \$ 77,175.00 for salary and fringe per the Budgetary Schedule, attached hereto, to the City of White Settlement (“**Sub-Grantee**”). In consideration, the Sub-Grantee agrees to contribute match funds for salary and fringe in the amount of \$ 19,294.00 for enhancement of the program with a full-time detective position to the grant program.

CONFIDENTIAL FUNDS

The Texas Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority Guidelines for Control and Use of Confidential Funds will be utilized for the disbursement and reimbursement of confidential funds.

UNIFORM ASSURANCES

In accordance with §783.005 of the Texas Government Code Grantee and sub-grantee shall comply with the Uniform Assurances, attached hereto.

FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION & REPORTING

In accordance with §783.006 of the Texas Government Code Standard Financial Management Conditions the prescribed are applicable to all grants and agreements executed between affected entities:

Financial Reporting: Accurate, current, and complete disclosure of the financial results of grant related activities must be made in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of the grant.

Accounting Records: Grantee will maintain records, which adequately identify the source and application of funds, provided for grant related activities. These records will contain information pertaining to grant awards and obligations, unobligated balances, assets, liabilities, outlays or expenditures, and income.

Internal Control: Effective control and accountability will be maintained for all grant cash, real and personal property, and other assets. Grantee will safeguard all such property and assure that it is used for authorized grant purposes.

Page Budget Control: Actual expenditures will be kept within budgeted amounts for each grant.

Allowable Cost: Applicable cost principles, agency program regulations, and the terms of grant agreements shall be followed in determining the reasonableness, allowability, and allocability of costs.

Source Documentation: Accounting records must be supported by such source documentation as checks, paid bills, payroll records, receipts, timesheets, travel vouchers, and other records, etc. These source documents must be retained and made available for MVCPA staff when requested.

Cash Management: Grantee will establish reasonable procedures to ensure the receipt of reports on cash balances and cash disbursements in sufficient time to enable

them to prepare complete and accurate cash transactions reports to the awarding agency.

Reimbursement Grant: All expenditures reported will be based on actual amounts paid and documented. Reporting budgeted amounts or estimated costs as expenditures are not permitted and if used may result in payment suspension and possible termination of the grant.

Costs Incurred Outside the Program Period: Grant funds may not be obligated prior to the effective date without written permission of the MVCPA director or subsequent to the termination date of the grant period. All obligations must be consistent with the Statement of Grant Award and used for statutorily authorized purposes.

COMPLIANCE

Grantee and sub-grantee will comply with state law, program rules and regulations and the Statement of Grant Award. In addition, Grantee and sub-grantee represents and warrants that it will comply with all requirements imposed by the awarding agency concerning special requirements of law, program requirements, and other administrative requirements. Information, guidance and program rules can be found in the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority Grant Administrative Manual and if not found in the administrative manual, then grantee and sub-grantee must follow the Texas Grant Management Standards maintained under the authority of the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts. These grant management standards are used by the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority in the administration of the MVCPA grant program.

Sub-grantee Monitoring and Management: The local government must monitor the activities of the sub-grantee as necessary to ensure that sub-award performance goals are achieved and the sub-award is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with state law, rules, and the terms and conditions of the sub-award. Monitoring of the sub-grantee must include:

- (1) Reviewing financial and performance reports required by the local government.
- (2) Following-up and ensuring that the sub-grantee takes timely and appropriate action on all deficiencies pertaining to the sub-award provided to the sub-grantee from the local government detected through audits, on-site reviews, and other means.
- (3) Issuing a management decision for audit findings pertaining to the sub-award provided to the sub-grantee from the local government as required.

ACCEPTANCE OF RESTRICTIONS

Signature of this Agreement constitutes acceptance of all grant conditions, grant restrictions and the terms of all applicable laws.

This is to certify that the objectives of the Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force as stated in its Grant Application for the fiscal year(s) funding covered by this Agreement have been reviewed and that it is mutually agreed to cooperate to whatever extent is necessary in carrying out the work plan described in the application(s).

Additionally, each participating agency and entity is cognizant of the grant and agrees to abide by any and all rules or special conditions in relation to the application. Agencies or their representatives shall have the right to investigate, examine and audit at

any time any and all necessary books, papers, documents, records and personnel that pertain to this contract or any related subcontracts.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM CERTIFICATION

(10) **Debts and Delinquencies.** Grantee agrees that any payments due under the contract or grant shall be applied towards any debt or delinquency that is owed to the State of Texas.

(11) **Disaster Recovery Plan.** Upon request of Agency, Grantee shall provide copies of its most recent business continuity and disaster recovery plans.

(12) **Disclosure of Violations of Federal Criminal Law.** Grantee represents and warrants its compliance with 2 CFR § 200.113 which requires the disclosure in writing of violations of federal criminal law involving fraud, bribery, and gratuity and the reporting of certain civil, criminal, or administrative proceedings to SAM.

(13) **Disclosure Protections for Certain Charitable Organizations, Charitable Trusts & Private Foundations.** Grantee represents and warrants that it will comply with Section 2252.906 of the Texas Government Code relating to disclosure protections for certain charitable organizations, charitable trusts, and private foundations.

(14) **Dispute Resolution.** The dispute resolution process provided in Chapter 2009 of the Texas Government Code is available to the parties to resolve any dispute arising under the agreement.

(15) **Excluded Parties.** Grantee certifies that it is not listed in the prohibited vendors list authorized by Executive Order No. 13224, “Blocking Property and Prohibiting Transactions with Persons Who Commit, Threaten to Commit, or Support Terrorism”, published by the United States Department of the Treasury, Office of Foreign Assets Control.

(16) **Executive Head of a State Agency Affirmation.** Under Section 669.003 of the Texas Government Code, relating to contracting with an executive head of a state

agency, Grantee represents that no person who served as an executive of Agency, in the past four (4) years, was involved with or has any interest in the contract or grant. If Grantee employs or has used the services of a former executive of Agency, then Grantee shall provide the following information in the Response: name of the former executive, the name of the state agency, the date of separation from the state agency, the position held with Grantee, and the date of employment with Grantee.

(17) **Funding Limitation.** Grantee understands that all obligations of Agency under the contract or grant are subject to the availability of grant funds. The contract or grant is subject to termination or cancellation, either in whole or in part, without penalty to Agency if such funds are not appropriated or become unavailable.

(18) **Governing Law & Venue.** This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to the conflicts of law provisions. The venue of any suit arising under this agreement is fixed in any court of competent jurisdiction of Travis County, Texas, unless the specific venue is otherwise identified in a statute that directly names or otherwise identifies its applicability to the contracting state agency.

(19) **Indemnification.** TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY THE TEXAS CONSTITUTION, LAWS, AND RULES, AND WITHOUT WAIVING ANY IMMUNITIES OR DEFENSES AVAILABLE TO GRANTEE AS A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, GRANTEE SHALL DEFEND, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE STATE OF TEXAS AND AGENCY, AND/OR THEIR OFFICERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, REPRESENTATIVES, CONTRACTORS, ASSIGNEES, AND/OR DESIGNEES FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY, ACTIONS, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, OR SUITS, AND ALL RELATED COSTS, ATTORNEY FEES, AND EXPENSES ARISING OUT OF, OR RESULTING FROM ANY ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF GRANTEE OR ITS AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, SUBCONTRACTORS, ORDER FULFILLERS, OR SUPPLIERS OF SUBCONTRACTORS IN THE EXECUTION OR PERFORMANCE OF THE CONTRACT AND ANY PURCHASE ORDERS ISSUED UNDER THE CONTRACT. THE DEFENSE SHALL BE COORDINATED BY GRANTEE WITH THE OFFICE OF THE TEXAS ATTORNEY GENERAL WHEN TEXAS STATE AGENCIES ARE NAMED DEFENDANTS IN ANY LAWSUIT AND GRANTEE MAY NOT AGREE TO ANY SETTLEMENT WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING THE CONCURRENCE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE TEXAS ATTORNEY GENERAL. GRANTEE AND AGENCY AGREE TO FURNISH TIMELY WRITTEN NOTICE TO EACH OTHER OF ANY SUCH CLAIM.

(20) **Law Enforcement Agency Grant Restriction.** Grantee is a law enforcement agency regulated by Chapter 1701 of the Texas Occupations Code, Grantee represents and warrants that it will not use appropriated money unless the law enforcement agency is in compliance with all rules adopted by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE), or TCOLE certifies that it is in the process of achieving compliance with such rules.

(21) **Legal Authority.** Grantee represents that it possesses legal authority to apply for the grant. A resolution, motion or similar action has been duly adopted or passed as an official act of the Grantee's governing body, authorizing the filing of the Response, including all understandings and assurances contained therein, and directing and

authorizing the person identified as the official representative, or the designee of Grantee to act in connection with the Response and to provide such additional information as may be required.

(22) **Limitations on Grants to Units of Local Government.** Respondent acknowledges and agrees that appropriated funds may not be expended in the form of a grant to, or contract with, a unit of local government unless the terms of the grant or contract require that the funds received under the grant or contract will be expended subject to the limitations and reporting requirements similar to those provided by the following:

- (a) Parts 2 and 3 of the Texas General Appropriations Act, Art. IX, except there is no requirement for increased salaries for local government employees;
- (b) Sections 556.004, 556.005, and 556.006 of the Texas Government Code; and
- (c) Sections 2113.012 and 2113.101 of the Texas Government Code.

(23) **Lobbying Expenditure Restriction.** Grantee represents and warrants that Agency's payments to Grantee and Grantee's receipt of appropriated or other funds under the contract or grant are not prohibited by Sections 403.1067 or 556.0055 of the Texas Government Code which restrict lobbying expenditures.

(24) **No Conflicts of Interest (State).** Grantee represents and warrants that performance under the contract or grant will not constitute an actual or potential conflict of interest or reasonably create an appearance of impropriety. Further, Grantee represents and warrants that in the administration of the grant, it will comply with all conflict of interest prohibitions and disclosure requirements required by applicable law, rules, and policies, including Chapter 176 of the Texas Local Government Code. If circumstances change during the course of the contract or grant, Grantee shall promptly notify Agency.

(25) **No Waiver of Sovereign Immunity.** The Parties expressly agree that no provision of the grant or contract is in any way intended to constitute a waiver by the Agency or the State of Texas of any immunities from suit or from liability that the Agency or the State of Texas may have by operation of law.

(26) **Open Meetings.** Grantee represents and warrants its compliance with Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code which requires all regular, special or called meeting of a governmental body to be open to the public, except as otherwise provided by law.

(27) **Political Polling Prohibition.** Respondent represents and warrants that it does not perform political polling and acknowledges that appropriated funds may not be granted to, or expended by, any entity which performs political polling.

(28) **Texas Public Information Act.** Information, documentation, and other

material in connection with this Solicitation or any resulting contract or grant may be subject to public disclosure pursuant to Chapter 552 of the Texas Government Code (the "Public Information Act"). In accordance with Section 2252.907 of the Texas Government Code, Grantee is required to make any information created or exchanged with the State pursuant to the contract or grant, and not otherwise excepted from disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act, available in a format that is accessible by the public at no additional charge to the State.

(29) **Reporting Compliance.** Grantee represents and warrants that it will submit timely, complete, and accurate reports in accordance with the grant and maintain appropriate backup documentation to support the reports.

(30) **Records Retention (State-Grant).** Grantee shall maintain and retain all records relating to the performance of the grant including supporting fiscal documents adequate to ensure that claims for grant funds are in accordance with applicable State of Texas requirements. These records will be maintained and retained by Grantee for a period of four (4) years after the grant expiration date or until all audit, claim, and litigation matters are resolved, whichever is later. Agency reserves the right to direct a Grantee to retain documents for a longer period of time or transfer certain records to Agency custody when it is determined the records possess longer term retention value. Grantee must include the substance of this clause in all subawards and subcontracts.

(31) **Reporting Suspected Fraud and Unlawful Conduct.** Grantee represents and warrants that it will comply with Section 321.022 of the Texas Government Code, which requires that suspected fraud and unlawful conduct be reported to the State Auditor's Office.

(32) **State Auditor's Right to Audit.** The state auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of any entity receiving funds from the state directly under the contract or indirectly through a subcontract under the contract. The acceptance of funds directly under the contract or indirectly through a subcontract under the contract acts as acceptance of the authority of the state auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. Under the direction of the legislative audit committee, an entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation by the state auditor must provide the state auditor with access to any information the state auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit.

(33) **Sub-Award Monitoring.** Grantee represents and warrant that it will monitor the activities of the sub-grantee as necessary to ensure that the sub-award is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with applicable statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the sub-award, and that sub-award performance goals are achieved.

In April of this year, a Public Hearing was held to choose the selection of 1000 Block of Bridle Avenue Sanitary Sewer line Replacement as the project for the Tarrant County Community Block Grant program.

In May of this year, the Professional Services Agreement with James DeOtte Engineering Inc. was approved for the project's engineering design. Once the design was completed, they were sent to Tarrant County to be sent out for bid. The bid date was September 20, 2023, in which five bids were received, with R & D Burns Brothers submitting the lowest bid at \$209,480.50. The original Estimated costs for the project were as follows;

Original construction cost - \$255,892.25

Tarrant County grant amount estimate -\$160,000.00

City Participation amount- \$95,892.25

Actual construction Cost per bid- 209,480.50

Tarrant County Grant Amount (verified) \$170,000

The City's participation amount (adjusted) is \$60,430.00

This is a savings of just over \$35,000 from the estimated amounts approved by the Council.

R & D Burns Brothers has worked in the city on Rumfield, and I have worked with them on several projects in another city. The funds are included in this year's Water Fund budget

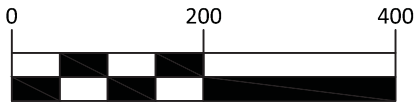

ISSUE

The City Council needs to approve annual updates to the Investment Policy as required by the Local Government Code and Public Funds Investment Act.

DISCUSSION

Valley View Consulting is our investment advisor and reviews our policy annually for needed updates. The following changes were made to the policy:

- Updated the order of items in the Investment Strategy section to match PFIA's order of priority (moved liquidity ahead of marketability)
- Changed name to Annual Comprehensive Financial Report
- Added Council of Governments to investment training groups
- Language updated to *avoid* collusion rather than *control* it
- Removed avoidance of physical delivery of securities since the investments you can use are no longer physically delivered, so it is not applicable anymore
- Removed the sample Certificate of Business Organization form since firms that need to provide this will have their own forms
- Grammatical updates (commas and word change from "has to" to "must")

ACTION

The finance department requests the City Council approve a resolution to approve annual investment policy updates.

CITY OF WHITE SETTLEMENT

INVESTMENT POLICY

Approved October 10, 2023

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to set forth specific policy and strategy guidelines for the City of White Settlement (the “City”) in order to achieve the goals of safety, liquidity, public trust, and yield. This Policy serves to satisfy the statutory requirement (specifically the Public Funds Investment Act, Chapter 2256, Texas Government Code, the “Act”), to define, adopt and review a formal investment strategy policy.

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The City maintains portfolios which utilize four investment strategy considerations designed to address the unique characteristics of the fund groups represented in the portfolios:

A. Operating Funds and Comingled Pooled Cash

Suitability - Any investment eligible in the Investment Policy is suitable for Operating Funds.

Safety of Principal - All investments shall be of high quality with no perceived default risk. Market price fluctuations may occur. However, by managing the weighted average days to maturity for the Operating Fund’s portfolio to less than 365 days and restricting the maximum allowable maturity to two years, the price volatility of the overall portfolio will be minimized.

Liquidity - The Operating Fund requires the greatest short-term liquidity of any of the Fund types. Cash equivalent investments will provide daily liquidity and may be utilized as a competitive yield alternative to fixed maturity investments.

Marketability - Securities with active and efficient secondary markets are necessary in the event of an unanticipated cash flow requirement. Historical market “spreads” between the bid and offer prices of a particular security-type of less than ten basis points will define an efficient secondary market.

Diversification - Investment maturities should be staggered throughout the budget cycle to provide cash flow based on the anticipated operating needs of the City. Market cycle risk will be reduced by diversifying the appropriate maturity structure out through two years.

Yield - Attaining a competitive market yield for comparable investment-types and portfolio restrictions is the desired objective. The yield of an equally weighted, rolling three-month Treasury Bill portfolio will be the minimum yield objective.

B. Debt Service Funds

Suitability - Any investment eligible in the Investment Policy is suitable for

the Debt Service Fund.

Safety of Principal - All investments shall be of high quality with no perceived default risk. Market price fluctuations may occur. However, by managing Debt Service Funds to not exceed the debt service payment schedule the market risk of the overall portfolio will be minimized.

Liquidity - Debt Service Funds have predictable payment schedules. Therefore, investment maturities should not exceed the anticipated cash flow requirements. Cash equivalent investments may provide a competitive yield alternative for short term fixed maturity investments. A singular repurchase agreement may be utilized if disbursements are allowed in the amount necessary to satisfy any debt service payment. This investment structure is commonly referred to as a flexible repurchase agreement.

Marketability - Securities with active and efficient secondary markets are not necessary as the event of an unanticipated cash flow requirement is not probable.

Diversification - Market conditions influence the attractiveness of fully extending maturity to the next “unfunded” payment date. Generally, if investment rates are anticipated to decrease over time, the City is best served by locking in most investments. If the interest rates are potentially rising, then investing in shorter and larger amounts may provide advantage. At no time shall the debt service schedule be exceeded in an attempt to bolster yield.

Yield - Attaining a competitive market yield for comparable investment-types and portfolio restrictions is the desired objective. The yield of an equally weighted, rolling three-month Treasury Bill portfolio shall be the minimum yield objective.

C. **Debt Service Reserve Funds**

Suitability - Any investment eligible in the Investment Policy is suitable for Debt Service Reserve Funds. Bond resolution and loan documentation constraints and insurance company restrictions may create specific considerations in addition to the Investment Policy.

Safety of Principal - All investments shall be of high quality with no perceived default risk. Market price fluctuations may occur. However, managing Debt Service Reserve Fund maturities to not exceed the call provisions of the borrowing reduces the investment’s market risk if the City’s debt is redeemed and the Reserve Fund liquidated. No stated final investment maturity shall exceed the shorter of the final maturity of the borrowing or three years. Annual mark-to-market requirements or specific maturity and average life limitations within the borrowing’s documentation will influence the attractiveness of market risk and reduce the opportunity for maturity extension.

Liquidity - Debt Service Reserve Funds have no anticipated expenditures. The Funds are deposited to provide annual debt service payment protection to the City's debt holders. The funds are "returned" to the City at the final debt service payment. Market conditions and arbitrage regulation compliance determine the advantage of investment diversification and liquidity. Generally, if investment rates exceed the cost of borrowing, the City is best served by locking in investment maturities and reducing liquidity. If the borrowing cost cannot be exceeded, then concurrent market conditions will determine the attractiveness of locking in maturities or investing shorter and anticipating future increased yields.

Marketability - Securities with less active and efficient secondary markets are acceptable for Debt Service Reserve Funds.

Diversification - Market conditions and the arbitrage regulations influence the attractiveness of staggering the maturity of fixed rate investments for Debt Service Reserve Funds. At no time shall the final debt service payment date of the bond issue be exceeded in an attempt to bolster yield.

Yield - Achieving a positive spread to the applicable borrowing cost is the desired objective. Debt Service Reserve Fund portfolio management shall at all times operate within the limits of the Investment Policy's risk constraints.

D. Capital Projects or Special Purpose Funds

Suitability - Any investment eligible in the Investment Policy is suitable for Capital Projects or Special Purpose Funds.

Safety of Principal - All investments will be of high quality with no perceived default risk. Market fluctuations may occur. However, by restricting the maximum maturity to three years and by managing Capital Projects or Special Purpose Funds to balance the short term and long term anticipated cash flow requirements, the market risk of the portfolio will be minimized.

Liquidity - Capital Projects or Special Purpose Funds used as part of a CIP plan or scheduled repair and replacement program are reasonably predictable. However unanticipated needs or emergencies may arise. Selecting investment maturities that provide greater cash flow than the anticipated needs will reduce the liquidity risk of unanticipated expenditures.

Marketability - The balancing of short-term and long-term cash flow needs requires the short-term portion of the Capital Projects or Special Purpose Funds portfolio to have securities with active and efficient secondary markets. Historical market "spreads" between the bid and offer prices of a particular security-type of less than ten basis points will define an efficient secondary market. Securities with less active and efficient secondary markets are acceptable for the long-term portion of the portfolio.

Diversification - Investment maturities should blend the short-term and long-term cash flow needs to provide adequate liquidity, yield enhancement, and stability. A “barbell” maturity ladder may be appropriate.

Yield - Attaining a competitive market yield for comparable investment-types and portfolio structures is the desired objective. The yield of an equally weighted, rolling six-month Treasury Bill portfolio will be the minimum yield objective.

INVESTMENT POLICY

I. SCOPE OF POLICY

This Investment Policy shall govern the investment activities of all funds of the City. This Policy serves to satisfy the State statute requirement to define and adopt a formal investment policy.

Funds Included

All financial assets of all current funds of the City, and any new funds created in the future, unless specifically exempted, will be administered in accordance with the objectives and restrictions set forth in this Policy. These funds are accounted for in the City's Annual Comprehensive Financial Report and include, but are not limited to: General Fund, Enterprise Funds, Special Revenue Funds, Debt Service Funds, Capital Projects Funds, and Permanent Funds.

The City will consolidate cash balances from all applicable funds, with the exception of certain restricted funds, to optimize investment earnings. Investment earnings will be allocated to the various funds based upon their respective participation and in accordance with generally acceptable accounting principles.

Funds Excluded

This Policy shall not govern funds managed under separate investment programs. Such funds include: funds established by the City for deferred employee compensation plans, the City's participation in the Texas Municipal Retirement System, and defeased bonds that are held in trust escrow accounts. The City will maintain responsibility for these funds as required by Federal and State law and the City Charter and Code.

II. OBJECTIVES OF POLICY

The City shall manage and invest its cash with four objectives, listed in order of priority: Safety, Liquidity, Public Trust, and Yield. The foremost and primary objective of the City's investment program is the preservation and safety of the principal. All investments shall be designed and managed in a manner responsive to the public trust and consistent with State and Federal law.

The City shall maintain a comprehensive cash management program which includes collection of accounts receivable, vendor payments in accordance with invoice terms, and prudent investment of all available cash. Cash management is defined as the process of managing monies in order to ensure maximum cash availability and maximum interest income on short-term investment of pooled idle cash.

Safety

The foremost and primary objective of the City's investment program is the preservation and safety of capital in the overall portfolio. Each investment transaction shall be conducted in a manner to avoid capital losses, whether they are from issuer defaults or erosion of market value.

Liquidity

The City's investment portfolio shall remain sufficiently liquid to enable the City to meet operating requirements that might be reasonably anticipated. This shall be achieved by matching investment maturities with forecasted cash flow requirements, by investing in securities with active secondary markets, and by diversification of maturities and call dates. Furthermore, since all possible cash demands cannot be anticipated, a portion of the portfolio also may be placed in cash equivalent investments.

Public Trust

All employees involved in the City's investment program shall seek to act responsibly as custodians of the public trust. All employees involved in the investment process shall avoid any transaction which might impair public confidence in the City's ability to govern effectively.

Yield

The City's investment portfolio shall be designed with the objective of regularly exceeding the average rate of return on three-month U.S. Treasury Bills. The investment program shall seek to augment returns above this threshold consistent with risk limitations identified herein, cash flow characteristics of the portfolio and prudent investment policies. This Policy establishes "weighted average yield to maturity" as the standard portfolio performance measurement.

III. RESPONSIBILITY AND CONTROL

Delegation of Authority and Training

Authority to manage the City's investment program is derived from the City Council. The City Manager and Finance Director are designated as the Investment Officers of the City and are responsible for investment decisions and activities and have the explicit authorization of the City Council to withdraw, transfer, deposit, and invest City funds. Oversight management responsibility for the investment program has been delegated to the Finance Director to establish written procedures and controls for the operation of the investment program, consistent with this Policy. Such procedures shall include explicit authorization to designate persons responsible for the daily cash management operation, the execution of investment transactions, overall portfolio management and investment reporting. In the absence of the City Manager or the Finance Director, the Assistant City Manager is authorized to act on behalf of the City Manager and the Assistant Finance

Director is authorized to act on behalf of the Finance Director. In the case that the City does not have an Assistant City Manager or Assistant Finance Director, the Parks & Recreation Director shall act on behalf of the City Manager or Finance Director.

No person shall engage in an investment transaction except as provided under the terms of this Policy and the procedures established by the Finance Director. The Investment Officers shall be responsible for all transactions undertaken and shall establish a system of controls to regulate the activities of any subordinates.

All Investment Officers shall be required to receive investment training to ensure the quality and capability of investment management. The training must include education in investment controls, security risks, strategy risks, market risks, diversification of investment portfolios, and compliance with the Act. Training will be provided through courses and seminars offered by independent professional organizations and associations, including the Council of Governments, Government Treasurers' Organization of Texas (GTOT), the University of North Texas Center for Public Management, the Government Finance Officers Association of Texas (GFOAT), and the Texas Municipal League (TML). Training shall consist of 10 hours accumulated within 12 months of assuming office and 8 hours accumulated every 2 years thereafter as required by the Act.

Ethics and Conflicts of Interest

City staff involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution and management of the investment program, or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions. City staff shall disclose to the City Manager any material financial interests in financial institutions that conduct business with the City, and they shall further disclose positions that could be related to the performance of the City's portfolio. City staff involved in the investment process shall refrain from undertaking personal investment transactions with the same individual with whom business is conducted on behalf of the City.

An Investment Officer of the City who has a personal business relationship with an organization seeking to sell an investment to the City shall file a statement disclosing that personal business interest. An Investment Officer who is related within a second degree of affinity or consanguinity to an individual seeking to sell an investment to the City shall file a statement disclosing that relationship. A statement required under this subsection must be filed with the Texas Ethics Commission and the City Council.

Internal Controls

The Finance Director is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure. The controls shall be designed to ensure that the assets of the City are protected from loss due to employee error, fraud, theft, or misuse. The internal control structure shall be designed to provide reasonable assurance that these objectives are met. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that (1) the cost of a control should not exceed the benefits likely to be derived; and (2) the valuation of costs and benefits requires estimates and judgements by management.

The internal controls shall address the following points:

- A. Avoidance of collusion,
- B. Separation of duties,
- C. Custodial safekeeping,
- D. Clear delegation of authority to subordinate staff members, and
- E. Written confirmation for telephone transactions for investments and wire transfers.

Compliance Audit

In conjunction with the annual financial audit, an independent auditor shall perform an annual compliance audit of management controls on investments and adherence to the City's established investment policies.

Prudence

The standard of care to be applied by the Investment Officers shall be the "prudent person" rule which states: "Investments shall be made with judgment and care, under prevailing circumstances, that a person of prudence, discretion, and intelligence would exercise in the management of the person's own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the probable safety of capital and the probable income to be derived." In determining whether an Investment Officer has exercised prudence with respect to an investment decision, the determination shall be made taking the following into consideration:

- A. The investment of all funds, or funds under the City's control, over which the Investment Officer had responsibility rather than a consideration as to the prudence of a single investment.
- B. Whether the investment decision was consistent with the written Investment Policy of the City.

Investment Officers, acting in accordance with written procedures and exercising due diligence, shall not be held personally responsible for a specific issuer's credit risk or market price changes, provided these deviations from expectation are reported in a timely manner and that appropriate action is taken to control adverse developments.

IV. REPORTING

Quarterly Reporting

The Finance Director shall prepare a quarterly investment report, signed by all Investment Officers, that provides an analysis of the status of the current investment portfolio and transactions made over the last quarter. The report shall summarize investments, maturities, and information as required by the Act.

Annual Review

If the City invests in investments other than money market mutual funds, investment pools, or CDs and money market accounts offered by its depository bank, the City's quarterly reports will be formally reviewed, in conjunction with the annual financial audit, by an independent auditor. The results of the audit shall be reported to the City Council by the independent auditor as a component of the annual audit.

Methods

The quarterly investment report shall include a succinct management summary that provides a clear picture of the status of the current investment portfolio and transactions made over the last quarter. This management summary will be prepared in a manner which will allow the City to ascertain whether investment activities during the reporting period have conformed to this Policy. The report will be provided to the City Manager and City Council. The report will include the following:

- A. A listing of individual investments held at the end of the reporting period,
- B. Unrealized gains and losses resulting from appreciation or depreciation by listing the cost and market value of investments,
- C. Average weighted yield to maturity of City investments as compared to an applicable benchmark,
- D. Listing of investment maturity dates,
- E. The percentage of the total portfolio that each type of investment represents, and
- F. Statement of compliance of the City's investment portfolio with State law and the investment strategies and policy approved by the City Council.

At least quarterly, the Investment Officers shall monitor market values and issuer ratings (as applicable) obtained from independent news sources, business organizations, or portfolio reporting services, and report the market values and ratings in the quarterly investment reports.

V. INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO

Active Portfolio Management

The City shall pursue an active versus passive portfolio management philosophy. That is, investments may be sold or redeemed before they mature if market conditions present an opportunity for the City to benefit from the trade. The Investment Officers will routinely monitor the contents of the portfolio, the available markets, and the relative value of competing instruments, and will adjust the portfolio accordingly.

Investments

Funds of the City may be invested in the following instruments (investments not specifically listed below are not authorized):

- A. Obligations, including letters of credit, of the United States or its agencies and instrumentalities, including the Federal Home Loan Banks.
- B. Direct obligations of the State of Texas or its agencies and instrumentalities.
- C. Other obligations, the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed or insured by, or backed by the full faith and credit of, the State of Texas or the United States or their respective agencies and instrumentalities, including obligations that are fully guaranteed or insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or by the explicit full faith and credit of the United States.
- D. Obligations of states, agencies, counties, cities, and other political subdivisions of any state, rated as to investment quality by a nationally recognized investment rating firm, and having received a rating of not less than “A” or its equivalent.
- E. Certificates of Deposit and other forms of deposit in a depository institution that has its main office or branch office in Texas; are guaranteed or insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, or its successor; or are secured by obligations in any manner and amount provided by law for deposits of the City. Or, deposits placed through a broker or financial institution that has its main office or a branch office in Texas that arranges for deposit of the funds in one or more federally insured depository institutions, wherever located, for an account of the City, and in compliance with the requirements of the Act.
- F. Fully collateralized direct repurchase agreements with a defined termination date; secured by cash or obligations of the United States or its agencies and instrumentalities; pledged to the City, held in the City’s account, and deposited at the time of purchase with a third party, selected and approved by the Finance Director, other than an agency for the pledgor. Repurchase agreements must be purchased through a primary government securities dealer, as defined by the Federal Reserve, or a financial institution doing business in Texas.

- G. SEC registered, no load, government money market mutual funds that comply with the requirements of the Act and seek to maintain a stable \$1.0000 net asset value.
- H. Local government investment pools which invest in instruments and follow practices allowed by State law and meet the requirements outlined in the Act (Section 2256.016). Local government investment pools must be rated AAA or AAAM or their equivalents by a nationally recognized credit rating agency.

The City shall take prudent measures to liquidate any investment that is downgraded to less than the minimum rating required. Pursuant to the Act, the City is not required to liquidate investments that were authorized investments at the time of purchase.

Not Authorized

The City's authorized investment options are more restrictive than those allowed by State law. State law prohibits investment in the following investments:

- A. Obligations whose payment represents the coupon payments on the outstanding principal balance of underlying mortgage-backed security collateral and pays no principal.
- B. Obligations whose payment represents the principal stream of cash flow from the underlying mortgage-backed security collateral and bears no interest.
- C. Collateralized mortgage obligations that have a stated final maturity date greater than 10 years.
- D. Collateralized mortgage obligations the interest rate of which is determined by an index that adjusts opposite to the changes in a market index.

Holding Period

The City intends to match the holding periods of investment funds with the liquidity needs of the City. In no case will the average maturity of investments of the City's operating funds exceed one year. The maximum final stated maturity of any investment shall not exceed three years.

Risk and Diversification

The City recognizes that investment risks can result from issuer defaults, market price changes or various technical complications leading to temporary illiquidity. Risk is controlled through portfolio diversification which shall be achieved by the following general guidelines:

- A. Risk of issuer default is controlled by limiting investments to those instruments allowed by the Act, which are described herein.

- B. Risk of market price changes shall be controlled by avoiding over-concentration of assets in a specific maturity sector, limitation of dollar weighted average maturity of operating investments to one-year, and avoidance of over-concentration of assets by type of investment, where applicable.
- C. Risk of illiquidity due to technical complications shall be controlled by the selection of securities dealers as described herein.

VI. SELECTION OF BANKS AND INVESTMENT PROVIDERS

Primary Depository

In accordance with State law, a primary depository shall be selected through the City's banking services procurement process, which shall include a formal request for application (RFA) that results in a choice most advantageous to the City. In selecting a primary depository, the credit worthiness of institutions shall be considered, and the Finance Director shall conduct a comprehensive review of prospective depositories' credit characteristics and financial history.

Certificates of Deposits and Other Forms of Deposit

Banks seeking to establish eligibility for the City's competitive deposit placement program shall submit for review annual financial statements, evidence of federal insurance and other information as required by the Finance Director.

Broker/Dealers

For broker/dealers, the City Council shall, at least annually, review, revise, and adopt a list of qualified broker/dealers that are authorized to engage in investment transactions with the City. The City shall select only those broker/dealers reporting to the Markets Reports Division of the Federal Reserve Board of New York, also known as the "Primary Government Security Dealers," or non-primary dealers that qualify under Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) Rule 15C3-1 (uniform net capital rule). All broker/dealers shall provide the City with references from public entities which they are currently serving.

Competitive Environment

It is the policy of the City to create a competitive environment for all individual security purchases and sales, financial institution deposits, money market mutual funds, and local government investment pools.

Business Organization Certification

Local government investment pools and discretionary investment management firms shall provide certification of having read the City's Investment Policy signed by a qualified representative of the organization, acknowledging that the organization has implemented

reasonable procedures and controls in an effort to preclude imprudent investment activities arising out of investment transactions conducted between the City and the organization in accordance with the Act.

VII. SAFEKEEPING AND CUSTODY

Insurance and Collateral

With the exception of deposits secured with irrevocable letters of credit at 100% of amount, all financial institution deposits and repurchase agreement investments of City funds shall be secured by pledged collateral. In order to anticipate market changes and provide a level of security for all funds, the minimum pledged securities collateralization market value will be 102% of the principal and accrued interest on the deposits or investments less an amount insured by the FDIC. Evidence of pledged collateral shall be maintained by the Finance Director. Repurchase agreements shall be documented by a specific agreement noting the collateral pledge in each agreement. Collateral shall be reviewed at least monthly to assure that the market value of the pledged collateral is adequate. The City reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to accept or reject any form of insurance or collateralization pledged towards deposits.

Custodial and Collateralization Agreements

Collateral pledged to secure deposits of the City shall be held by an independent third party custodial institution in accordance with a custodial agreement which clearly defines the procedural steps for gaining access to the collateral should the City determine that the City's funds are in jeopardy. The custodian institution, or trustee, shall be the Federal Reserve Bank or an institution not affiliated with the firm pledging the collateral.

All financial institutions pledging securities as collateral shall be required to sign a collateralization agreement with the City. The agreement shall define the City's rights to the collateral in case of default, bankruptcy, or closing and shall establish a perfected security interest in compliance with Federal and State regulations, including:

- The agreement must be in writing;
- The agreement must be executed by the financial institution and the City contemporaneously with the deposit;
- The agreement must be approved by the Board of Directors or designated committee of the financial institution and a copy of the meeting minutes must be delivered to the City; and
- The agreement must be part of the financial institution's "official record" continuously since its execution.

Collateral Defined

For financial institution deposits, the City shall accept eligible collateral as defined by the Public Funds Collateral Act. For repurchase agreements, the City shall accept eligible collateral as defined by the Act.

Subject to Audit

All collateral shall be subject to inspection and audit by the Finance Director or the City's independent auditors.

Delivery Versus Payment

All investments shall be purchased using the delivery versus payment method (DVP), where applicable. That is, funds shall not be wired or paid until verification has been made that the correct investment was received by the City's safekeeping agent. The investment shall be held in the City's account or on behalf of the City. The safekeeping agent's records shall assure the notation of the City's ownership of or explicit claim on the investment. The original copy of all safekeeping receipts shall be delivered to the City.

VIII. INVESTMENT POLICY ADOPTION

The City Investment Policy shall be adopted by resolution of the City Council, at least annually. The Policy shall be reviewed for effectiveness on an annual basis by the Finance Department and any modifications will be recommended for approval to the City Council.
